**Results are based on telephone interviews conducted June 7-11, 2017 with a random sample of 1,009 adults, ages 18+, living in all 50 U.S. states and the District of Columbia. For results based on this sample of national adults, the margin of sampling error is  $\pm 4$  percentage points at the 95% confidence level.**

**For results based on the sample of 489 national adults in Form A, the margin of sampling error is  $\pm 5$  percentage points.**

**For results based on the sample of 520 national adults in Form B, the margins of sampling error is  $\pm 5$  percentage points.**

**For results based on the sample of 504-- adults employed full- or part-time, the margin of sampling error is  $\pm 5$  percentage points.**

**Interviews are conducted with respondents on landline telephones and cellular phones, with interviews conducted in Spanish for respondents who are primarily Spanish-speaking. Each sample of national adults includes a minimum quota of 70% cell phone respondents and 30% landline respondents, with additional minimum quotas by time zone within region. Landline and cell phone telephone numbers are selected using random digit dial methods. Gallup obtained sample for this study from Survey Sampling International**
